Commissioner Parsons called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.

Commissioner Parsons announced to postpone the October 5, 2016 Election Board Minutes.

Commissioner Parsons announced an Election Board Meeting is scheduled for Friday, November 4, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. in Conference Room No. 701, Lancaster County Government Center.

Public Hearing Re: Polling Place Change

Mr. Wenger reported notices were posted at various locations within the precinct, Lancaster Newspapers ran a story and both parties were made aware of the proposed polling place change, but he has not heard any feedback. Mr. Wenger noted they looked at six locations outside the precinct, as the one church within the precinct was not ADA equipped, and Ebenezer Baptist was the best to serve the voters.

ELECTION BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 11 OF 2016

On motion of Commissioner Stuckey, seconded by Commissioner Lehman;

WHEREAS, A public hearing was held on Wednesday, October 12, 2016 following the Commissioners' public meeting which starts at 9:15 a.m. for the designation of a polling place for Lancaster City – Sixth Ward, Fourth Precinct; and

WHEREAS, Proper notices of said hearing were posted by the Chief Clerk.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LANCASTER COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS, That the Board hereby designates the following polling place effective with the November 8, 2016 General Election:

Mr. Wenger said their office will mail out new voter registration cards with this change to the 1380 voters in this district. Mr. Wenger also updated the Board on preparations for the upcoming General Election, noting they have received 5900 voter registration changes, which come through PennDOT and the states online voter registration system, and have mailed out approximately 6,000 absentee ballots. Mr. Wenger also discussed the Court cases and confirmed for the Board that our ballot is set.

On motion of Commissioner Stuckey, seconded by Commissioner Lehman, the meeting adjourned at 9:39 a.m.
