Commissioner D'Agostino called the meeting to order at 9:53 a.m.

Commissioner D'Agostino announced approval of the March 16, 2022, Election Board meeting minutes.

Update on the 2022 Primary Election

Ms. Miller provided the following 2022 Primary Election updates: As of today, the total voter count for the county is 345,548 and mail ballot request is at 21,141. The Districts for PA General Assembly have been finalized. Petitions were due by Monday, March 28, objections are now to be filed by April 4, 2022, and court decisions must be made by April 12.

Currently there is one statewide objection for a US Senate position and that case is to be heard April 4.

Casting of lots for all statewide, general assembly and state committees is due today at 10 a.m. This was a change from the original DOS directive.

Mail ballots – as long as there are no objections the office is on target to hit their original ballot drop date.

Poll worker training is next week April 4-9. There are about 100 new judges/inspectors, three classes for them and eight classes for returning judges.

Ms. Miller said absentee ballots will be mailed out on April 18.

Commissioner Parsons said he concerned about vendor errors in the ballot. Ms. Miller said it is a one-page ballot. He said as he is out in the community, it is frustrating for people to have two different petition periods and all these constant changes. He thanked Ms. Miller and her team for the work they are doing in trying to make the process clearer for people.

Commissioner D'Agostino also thanked the staff for everything they are doing.

Commissioner Trescot said he is in favor of a nonpartisan commission so there would not be delays and maps would have been drawn sooner, fairer and clearer.

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Parsons, the meeting adjourned at 10:04 a.m.

Motion passed unanimously.
