Commissioner D'Agostino called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner D'Agostino announced approval of the September 6, 2023, Commissioners' Meeting Minutes.

Commissioner D'Agostino inquired whether any of those in attendance were present for the Human Services Block Grant Hearing noted on the agenda. Hearing none, it was noted that the Human Services Block Grant hearing would remain as item 5G on the agenda.

Introductions were made by the Board of Commissioners, staff and Eden Township Supervisors, Joseph Rineer, David Rineer and Lawrence Stoltzfus.

Mr. Swinehart gave a presentation on the Lancaster Farmland Trust ARPA Grant update.

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Trescot, it was agreed for the County of Lancaster, acting on behalf of the Prison, to approve the following:

New Agreement With:

Donegal Substance Abuse Alliance (DSAA)
Mount Joy, PA

Purpose:

To provide case management, support, linkages, advocacy, and communication in the community for inmates, post release, who participated in the Prison's Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) program for those diagnosed with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD). DSAA will work closely with the prison's medical provider, security, and treatment team members to facilitate a warm handoff for inmates' release from the Prison to reintegration back into the community.

**Lancaster County Commissioners' Meeting
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Amount/Terms: Not to exceed \$142,598.00 for the period July 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024.
Funding: No effect on the budget as this contract is funded through the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) State Opioid Response Grant, which was awarded to Lancaster County on June 28, 2023 in the amount of \$500,000.00.

Motion passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 63 OF 2023

On motion of Commissioner Trescot, seconded by Commissioner Parsons, it was agreed for the County of Lancaster to approve the fifth extension agreement with Schaad Detective Agency, York, PA, to supply Level 1 and Level 2 guards services for the Sheriff's Office at the rates Level 1 (unarmed)- \$37.93/hour and Level 2 (armed) - \$53.66/hour for the period September 8, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

In addition, it was agreed for the County of Lancaster to recognize \$144,315.00 in revenues from County American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to the General Fund and appropriate them for the same total in the following General Fund accounts for purpose listed below. The use of these funds will free up General Fund balances to partially offset the costs associated with this extension.

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Trescot, it was agreed for the County of Lancaster, acting on behalf of the Sheriff's Office, to approve the following:

<u>Change Order With:</u>	Teleosoft Corporation York PA
 <u>Purpose:</u>	 To add Return of Service (ROS) function to County Suite Warrants which will provide an automated system to pull served warrants from the existing Magisterial District Judge case management system and generate a ROS for the Sheriff's Office to collect processing fees. This project is to be completed by the end of the year.
 <u>Amount/Term:</u>	 \$41,800.00. Services subject to the terms and conditions in the master agreement.
 <u>Funding:</u>	 Costs covered by a Records Improvement Committee (RIC) grant in the amount of \$41,800.00. The annual maintenance budget will increase \$4,800.00 and will be covered by the Sheriff's Office annual budget. Sole Source.

Motion passed unanimously.

On motion of Commissioner Trescot, seconded by Commissioner Parsons, it was agreed for the County of Lancaster, acting on behalf of the Human Resources Department, to amend the motion to reflect a three-year period for the collective bargaining agreement with the Lancaster County Detective Association which was approved on September 6, 2023.

Motion passed unanimously.

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RESOLUTION NO. 64 OF 2023

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Trescot;

WHEREAS, the County of Lancaster was selected by the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare as one of the original twenty counties for the Human Services Block Grant under Act 80 of 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Human Services Block Grant encompasses mental health and intellectual disabilities base funds, Act 152 drug and alcohol funds, behavioral health services initiative (BHSI) funds, the Human Services Development Fund and homeless assistance funding; and

WHEREAS, the counties continue to receive funding for the five line items based upon categorical allocations, but are permitted flexibility in their expenditure across program lines, with limitations; and

WHEREAS, counties are required to fund each of the five program areas and cannot defund any of the included line items completely; and

WHEREAS, counties are required to inform citizens and clients of changes that may be included in the proposed content of the Human Services Block Grant; and

WHEREAS, the County of Lancaster has opted to hold two public hearings, one held on August 31, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. and one to be held on September 12, 2023 at 7:00 p.m., to discuss the proposed Human Services Block Grant categorical funding allocations for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and provide opportunity for public comment; and

WHEREAS, the County of Lancaster will abide by the terms outlined in the County Human Services Plan Assurance of Compliance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA that the Lancaster County Human Services Block Grant Narrative Plan for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 be approved.

Motion passed unanimously.


Business From Guests:
