Commissioner D'Agostino called the meeting to order at 10:26 a.m.

Commissioner D'Agostino announced the approval of the October 14, 2020 Election Board Minutes and the postponement of approval of the September 23, 2020 Election Board Meeting Minutes, October 7, 2020 Election Board Minutes and October 28, 2020 Election Board Minutes.

**ELECTION BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 18 OF 2020**

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Lehman;

**WHEREAS**, There are vacancies on various election boards in a number of election districts in Lancaster County which remain unfilled; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 405 of the Pennsylvania Election Code authorizes the County Board of Elections to appoint qualified electors who have been trained by the County to perform the duties of election officers to fill vacancies on election boards that occur within five days of the date of any election; and

**WHEREAS**, The Board of Elections has a pool of qualified electors who have been trained by the County to perform the duties of election officials and are willing to serve at the General Election to be held on November 3, 2020, and desires to make the authorized appointments; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 404 of the Election Code authorizes the County Board of Elections to appoint a qualified registered elector from the county to serve as a machine inspector in any election district in which more than one voting machine is utilized; and

**WHEREAS**, There are a number of election districts in Lancaster County in which multiple voting machines are used; and

**WHEREAS**, The Board of Elections desires to appoint qualified registered electors as machine inspectors in those districts in which multiple voting machines are used; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Act 12 of 2020, the Board of Elections will begin pre-canvassing of mail-in ballots at 7:00 A.M. on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, and continue with the canvassing of ballots following the close of the polls on November 3, 2020, as prescribed by law, and will need persons to assist with that pre-canvassing and canvassing.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS OF LANCASTER COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA**, as follows:

1. Pursuant to Section 405 of the Election Code, the Board appoints the persons identified in Exhibit "A" attached to this Resolution to fill vacancies in the various election boards as more fully set forth in the Exhibit. The appointments shall be valid only for November 3, 2020, the day of the General Election. Any election board position filled by appointment herein shall be deemed vacant as of the day following the General Election.

2. Pursuant to Section 404 of the Election Code, the Board appoints the persons identified in Exhibit "B" attached to this Resolution as machine inspectors in those election districts where multiple voting machines are utilized, as more fully set forth in Exhibit "B". The appointments shall be valid only for November 3, 2020, the day of the General Election.
3. Pursuant to Act 12 of 2020, the Board appoints the persons identified in Exhibit "C" attached to this Resolution to assist with pre-canvassing and canvassing of ballots. The appointments shall be valid for the November, 2020, general election and shall continue until all pre-canvassing and canvassing duties have been completed.
4. Because the need for additional persons may arise during the pre-canvassing and canvassing of ballots, the Board delegates to the Chief Clerk the ability to retain qualified persons to assist with the pre-canvass and canvass of ballots, as needs dictate.

Motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Hausner explained that Mr. Newcomer, the Election Board Solicitor, drafted this resolution which indicates only those individuals who are specifically in the statute be admitted to pre-canvass and those are spelled out in the resolution. There were a number of media inquiries so the draft was changed to add credentialed media representatives to a designated area of the pre-canvass room subject to limitations of the Election Code with regard to representing, duplicating, video-taking or photographing ballots; which is strictly prohibited. The statute provides who must be permitted to be present at pre-canvassing and those individuals are representatives of a political party and a candidate. It does not say no one is allowed to admit anyone else except for those individuals who are mandated, so it is at their discretion to allow others to be present and on what conditions and terms they would deem advisable.

Mr. Newcomer said Ms. Hausner has identified what the statute does provide in terms of specifically identified persons who may be in the room, but it does not address or specifically prohibit other persons.

Commissioner Parsons thinks it makes sense to be transparent, noting the press are allowed a place at the warehouse every election but they need to be in a roped off area so they are not bothering or asking questions of the volunteers or taking pictures of any ballots. He has faith in Randall Wenger, his staff and their operations, but the press should not be walking around, they need to be contained in an area and those that will not should be asked to be removed.

Commissioner Lehman agreed we should be providing a space for the media especially because we are convening a public meeting at 7:00 a.m. and hopefully folks will be respectful in terms of how they conduct themselves inside the room.

Commissioner D'Agostino agreed with the idea of a roped off area for credentialed press. He also pointed out that it is probably best to have the actual convening of the pre-canvassing meeting, which is very short, in the lobby area because it is a public meeting and Freedom Hall is already set up for the pre-canvassing work.

**ELECTION BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 19 OF 2020**

**A Resolution of the Lancaster County Board of Elections Establishing Persons Permitted in the Pre-Canvass Meeting Room on the Day of a Primary, Municipal or General Election**

On motion of Commissioner Lehman, seconded by Commissioner Parsons, the Lancaster County Board of Elections ("Board") hereby adopts the following Resolution:

**WHEREAS**, Act 12 of 2020 amended Section 1308 of the Election Code to provide for the ability of the Board to meet no earlier than 7:00 a.m. on election day to pre-canvass absentee and mail-n ballots received prior to election day; and

**WHEREAS**, Subsection 1.1 of Section 1308 identifies those persons permitted to remain in the room in which the absentee ballots and mail-in ballots are pre-canvassed; and

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**WHEREAS**, the Board wishes to establish a policy to identify those persons, in addition to County employees and persons retained by the Board to pre-canvass absentee ballots and mail-in ballots, who may be in the room during the pre-canvass.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS OF LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA** that the Lancaster County Board of Elections hereby declares that those persons who may be in the room during the pre-canvass of absentee ballots and mail-in ballots shall include members of the Board, the County Chief Clerk, the County Solicitor and her staff, the Solicitor for the Board of Elections, and those persons employed by the County and/or retained by the Board to assist with the pre-canvass. In addition, one authorized representative of each candidate in an election and one representative from each political party shall be permitted to remain in the room. Also, credentialed members of the media shall be admitted to a specified section of the room designated for media. No other persons shall be permitted to remain in the room during the pre-canvass.

All individuals, including members of the media are prohibited from photographing, videotaping or duplicating the image of any ballots in accordance with the proscriptions of the Election Code and associated guidance.

ADOPTED this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November, 2020 by the Election Board of the County of Lancaster, Pennsylvania in lawful session duly assembled.

Motion passed unanimously.

**Voter registration Complaint:**

Mr. Wenger said Friday afternoon they received both a voter registration challenge and a mail ballot challenge for two voters and on Saturday afternoon the complainant advised the office of their desire to withdraw those challenges.

Mr. Newcomer said these are two distinct challenges, one being a registration challenge which may be filed at any time through the year and may be filed by one of the Commissioners, the Registrar, or an elector within the municipality for which the registration challenge is made. The ballot challenge however is governed by law and is specifically limited in terms of time, only permitted for a mail-in or absentee ballot or the grounds that the person who requested the ballot was not a qualified elector. This challenge may only be made up until 5:00 on the Friday prior to the election and when such a challenge is made to a ballot, \$10 fee is required to be posted with the County for each challenge, which was posted in this situation. There is a procedure for setting up a hearing within a specified period of time following the challenge where the Board would consider the challenge.

The election code also specifically provides, with the recent amendments, that a complainant making that challenge would have the right to withdraw that challenge and if it is withdrawn the \$10 is refunded to the person making the complaint. With the withdraw on Saturday there is no longer a ballot challenge, so there is nothing for this Board to do in terms of holding a hearing. However, the registration challenge may continue because even if, and the law is not clear, there is a withdraw by that elector, it does not specifically say that the registration challenge dies. Because it may be instituted at any time and it may be filed by a Commissioner or Registrar the ability to proceed with the registration challenge will be permitted. A registration challenge is prospective only, so at this particular point the only thing for this Board to consider or actually for the registration challenge moving forward.

Mr. Newcomer confirmed for Commissioner Lehman that because there are two boards any registration challenge is under the purview of the Registration Commission and any absentee or mail-in ballot challenge would be under the purview of the Election Board. Mr. Newcomer said both challenges have been withdrawn, however under Section 1329 an individual claiming the right to be registered may be challenged by a Commissioner, Registrar, Clerk or qualified elector of the municipality so if the Commission were to choose to move ahead and continue that process, a member of the Commission could file the challenge complaint, as could the Registrar, Clerk or qualified elector of the municipality. In answer to Commissioner Lehman's question if the statute spoke to the timing of withdraw, Mr. Newcomer explained that the law talks about the return of the \$10 if it is withdrawn within 5 days of the primary or general election.

Commissioner D'Agostino stated that based on what he has heard, it is his understanding that the ballots submitted from the voters in the now withdrawn registration challenge, will count during this election. Mr. Newcomer affirmed this understanding, clarifying that because the ballot challenge has been withdrawn per the code it would not affect the ballot for this election and even if the registration challenge would go forward it would be perspective, not retroactive.

Commissioner Lemman asked if the Board of Elections could simply refer the matter to the Registration Commission, but Mr. Newcomer recommended that there be a formal complaint because he thinks it eliminates any argument about the process and does not make it available for that voter to suggest that there has been a defect in the process. He also confirmed for Commissioner Parsons that they would have the ability to file a challenge complaint because of information received.

Commissioner Lehman said this instance is unique in that there was a challenge made, they do have some information related to the matter and then the challenge was withdrawn. In his opinion, it becomes harder under these circumstances to simply ignore it and it is something the Registration Commission should at least do its proper due diligence on at the proper time.

Commissioner Parsons said based on what he saw in the forwarded emails, this is a strange situation where you have someone who moved out of state, allegedly registered a business address and then submitted mail-in votes into Pennsylvania. It does cause him concern based on this and the fact that, after being notified, the person who made the challenge decided to withdraw it, noting we are now past the challenge deadline but he thinks we are going to have to convene the Registration Commission in the future to more fully deal with the actual substance.

Commissioners Lehman and D'Agostino agreed.

Commissioner D'Agostino said since they are all in agreement, they will proceed under that guidance and there is nothing for this Board to take action on.

**November 3, 2020 General Election Update:**

Mr. Wenger said in excess of 80,000 ballots have been returned and just under 110,000 were issued. They continue to have steady flow of voters seeking cancel and reissues along with some emergency absentees. They trained some additional judges with the concern in mind of folks who are finding out about COVID exposures and potential quarantines between now and tomorrow morning. He plans to be at the Convention Center with one full-time and one part-time employee, a few temps and the volunteers who were appointed today; and believes they will be able to get the ballots opened and recorded tomorrow.

On the Thursday, October 29<sup>th</sup> they received direction from the State regarding ballots received by mail after tomorrow night, November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 8:00 p.m. - the Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mail ballots that are postmarked prior to election day, which is to set them aside and record who they are from.

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They then got direction from the State on Sunday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, to fully canvass these ballots, scan them and report them but somehow keep them separate. He said there is not a way to do that in the Hart system. They could scan them and not read the v-drive with those results into their central system, but once they publicize those results by putting them on their website there is no way to undo that. There may be some voting systems that will allow that, it is not something we can do with ours - once the votes are added into the count, there is no way to unadd them. There is not a way to create a separate election for them like there might be in other voting systems because then those ballots will not scan in with the new election id. They will securely store them as they are coming in and see what unfolds with the other legal action going on. He expects they will get some ideas/guidance from our solicitors as well as to how they best proceed, what is actual procedural guidance and what if anything the courts have requested or directed as they try to determine what complying best looks like.

Commissioner D'Agostino said it is disconcerting to receive guidance last week to put these ballots aside and not counted as was told by the Secretary of State to U.S. Supreme Court, which stated it was going to hold off on a decision on the matter until after the election. Then yesterday, Sunday, the guidance was basically reversed by the Secretary of State. He appreciated Mr. Wenger looking into this but cannot see how else we can do anything but go forward with the original guidance, which is to set these ballots aside until further decision by the U.S. Supreme Court or other guidance that is in keeping with what the Court desired. He also stated that we do not have to actually canvass them until the end of the required canvassing period, which is 8 days after the election, noting that other ballots such as provisionals will be canvassed during that time as well.

Commissioner Lehman agrees you have to canvass any ballot that falls into the after 8 pm on Tuesday and by 5 pm on Friday category separately and asked Mr. Wenger to confirm there is no easy way to remove them from the totals once they are added in.

Mr. Wenger said we are not going to be able to run the full process and keep them separate, noting it is one election with one election result. He explained the canvassing process generally would be to scan ballots into SURE when they come in. Then they open up those ballots and scan them, but it does not do a lot of good because he cannot load the results and then be able to keep them separate as the State is suggesting in their guidance, that they be recorded separately.

Commissioner Lehman thinks he understand the technical piece, what he is trying to get to is right now the law based on the PA Supreme Court decision says that those ballots count if they are here by 5 pm on Friday; noting there is no mechanism to not include them in the total absent a court case and if that makes it difficult to adjust the counts later he is sorry about that but he does not know how you do not include them in the count because that is the law and until you have other law that says otherwise you cannot set them aside and pretend like they do not exist.

Commissioner Parsons stated that by law, the County has eight days to canvass ballots, so the ballots that arrive between Wednesday and Friday could be set aside. All of the ballots that are already here, we are going to count starting tomorrow, but there are still some that are going to come in on election day that are going to be counted the following day or later, maybe 5 or 7 thousand. However, the vast majority will be counted and the results known on election night, and then those that trickle in after election day must be kept separately.

Commissioner Parsons then read a statement from Johnathan Marks, the Deputy Secretary of Elections and Commissions, email sent out on October 29<sup>th</sup>, from Department of State - "Though the Secretary continues to strongly defend the three day extension to ensure every timely and validly cast ballot and absentee ballot is counted to ensure uniformity and respect the United State Supreme Court's consideration of the issues still before it. The Secretary strongly encourages each County Board of Elections to affirmatively confirm that it will comply with the attached guidance. The attached guidance says County Boards of Election shall not pre-canvass or canvass any mail-in or civilian absentee ballots received between 8 pm Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5 pm Friday, November 6<sup>th</sup> until further direction is received. These ballots shall be maintained by the County Board in a secure, safe and sealed container separate from other voted ballots." Meaning that the Secretary anticipated that this will be litigated by the United State Supreme Court and it makes sense to keep them separately. Then on November 1<sup>st</sup>, Sunday afternoon, we get new guidance from Mr. Marks saying that "the County Board of Elections shall canvass, segregate absentee and mail-in ballots received after 8 pm Tuesday, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, before Friday at 5 p.m. November 6<sup>th</sup>, as soon as possible upon receipt of the ballots and within the period specified by law for canvass. The canvass meeting shall continue until all segregate absentee mail-in ballots have been canvassed." In other words, jam them through as fast as possible which means they cannot then be removed, so he smells a rat. He asked his friends in the press to maybe ask the Department of State some hard questions about why this changed all the sudden, why they want them jammed through knowing logistically they cannot be removed from the count easily so the Commissioner would urge caution and follow the first set of advice, which made sense. We have 8 days to do this, we do not have to decide now, they can and should be set aside until we know the status of the litigation.

Commissioner Lehman said he is not defending the Department of State but thinks they thought they knew what the U.S. Supreme Court was going to do and were trying to get ahead of the curve, but the Court did not do what they thought they were going to do so they put out the guidance they should have put out to begin with.

Ms. Hausner added that in the litigation currently pending before the U.S. Supreme Court, we along with every other County, were asked would we abide by the guidance that was issued on October 29<sup>th</sup> because if so perhaps it would not be necessary to seek Court action to mandate that segregation of those ballots. So, we have already represented to litigants that we will abide by the October 29<sup>th</sup> guidance because this plan was discussed with Mr. Wenger.

Commissioner Lehman said we should be following the Department of State's latest guidance which is what he has been advocating throughout this entire process and the reason why is because, whether you agree or disagree with it, if you follow the guidance and the law, you have a consistent approach to elections throughout Pennsylvania. Nobody here is saying that if the Court rules these votes are not counted that we make sure they do anyway. What he is saying is you follow the guidance, you follow the process and even if it is difficult on the back end if the court rules strike down these votes we are smart enough to figure out how to adjust totals. He has confidence in our ability to do that but to not follow the process because of something that might happen or because we want to follow guidance before that has been changed now frankly is not rational.

Commissioner D'Agostino said his understanding is that once those are tallied it is not possible to remove them safely from the count and stands by putting them aside and holding them until we have further direction.

Mr. Wenger said the only process that would exist is to go in and do what would be called manual vote adjustments which are highly frowned upon because there is no way to back that up, you go in and manual start deducting votes.

Commissioner Lehman said that is why you separate these ballots because you do have a paper ballot and that is why we have this system, so there is no doubt of which ballots should not be counted, should the court rule that and if the litigation takes it to December, we are still not going to count them. There are no vote totals that are complete until the election is certified and if there is court challenge there is not going to be any totals.

Mr. Wachinski stated there has been a lot of discussion about what the law does or does not require and he thinks it is important for this body to remember that the law is Act 77, which, under a strict textual reading, says that to be counted, ballots must be in by 8 pm on election day. The state Supreme Court extended the deadline three days. A challenge is pending right now before the United States Supreme Court as to whether or not that is permissible or non-permissible. He cited the last page of the United States Supreme Court opinion in holding in abeyance its decision, that specifically says that Secretary Boockvar has in fact assured the United States Supreme Court that these ballots will be segregated, held separately until

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a period of time after the election when it becomes prudent, permissible and timely to make a decision. The United States Supreme Court has not said yes, we are going to agree with the Secretary or no we are going to disagree with the Secretary, it has merely said we do not have enough time and they are relying on her assurance that those ballots will not be canvassed. Their concern is every vote should count that is permissible by law and when those votes are counted, they should be free from malfeasants and potential fraud. He is not saying there are or are not going to be fraud but when there are open ballots floating around and segregated into a separate spot that have not been tallied, there is a question there. He thinks Mr. Wenger's office does a fine job and he is saying it is difficult if not impossible to do that canvassing and not put it in the system and walk it back, we should rely on the professional that this County has depended on time and time again to do a good job. They want to make sure it is fair and that everybody's vote gets counted as per the law and believe that the appropriate measure on this particular cause is to hold them in segregation until such time as a court rules or until the eight day period of time following the election expires.

Commissioner Parsons noted it is a good point about what she said to the United States Supreme Court and that is why this is so disturbing that we have new guidance that is in direct contravention of that.

Commissioner Lehman said none of that changes the fact that the Pennsylvania Supreme Court has already ruled on this matter.

Commissioner Parsons said we have all opined on Act 77 since it was passed and this is exactly why we have all said there is problems with it because there are so many little different permutations of this and it is frustrating.

Commissioner D'Agostino said the workers who have to carry this out need to have certainty of how they are going to handle this, and it is the consensus of the majority of the Board to continue along the lines of the previous guidance, which is to segregate and hold these ballots. He also confirmed for Mr. Wenger that the Board will want to revisit this when the election is over and if we do not have further guidance by the time we need to report results to the state.

Jody Blouck asked what happens to ballots that are rejected, are there any measures to cure ballots that are rejected ie: allowing those to be revealed, id numbers; what is set up in order to cure ballots that are rejected if there is no secrecy envelope and is there a process to allow those voters to be contacted so they can come cast a provisional ballot.

Mr. Wenger explained there is no process in place to cure a ballot in PA law. What the election code does say is that the County Board of Elections is prohibited from counting the provisional ballot of a voter who has submitted an absentee or mail-in ballot timely to the Board of Elections.

Commissioner Lehman said we had a long discussion on this last week. The Department of State has put out a code that would allow for the cancelation of the status of a ballot that came without a secrecy envelop, a "naked" ballot. If this situation is found during the pre-canvass at the Convention Center and that person had applied online, they could get an email notification letting them know that the status of their ballot had been changed and then they could go vote provisionally. His proposal would probably cost less than \$500 with the Convention Center's third-party vendor providing some terminals along with extension of our secure network; but there was not a majority on the Election Board to support it. He believes that when a "naked" ballot is set aside by definition the status of that should be changed because obviously that ballot is not going to be counted per the U.S. Supreme Court ruling, but given that it is Monday, one day before the pre-canvass is scheduled to begin, there is no way to implement that process now under any set of circumstances.

Commissioner Parsons said in the spring, under this new law, before there were any Court rulings, the Election Board at that time counted naked ballots in Lancaster County. It was up to each County. Subsequent to that, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court, which is dominated by Democrats, decided that we are not to count naked ballots. He anticipated if there had not been that ruling, Lancaster County would have again counted naked ballots, however we now have a ruling by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court that we must abide by. There was no provision in that ruling, nor is there any provision in the law to do what the Secretary of State is suggesting. We have to follow the law and be very careful about it. There are zero other Counties, out of the 67 in Pennsylvania, doing what has been suggested. No Republican controlled counties, no Democratic controlled counties. There is no way under the law to do that.

Commissioner Lehman noted there are counties that are starting their pre-canvassing after Election Day and he does not agree with them either. He thinks the Supreme Court got it wrong as far as "naked" ballots are concerned because voter intent is clear, there is no way you can argue that a ballot received without a secrecy envelop, generally speaking, previously the law is very clear on that when voter intent is clear the vote counts but the Pennsylvania Supreme Court did not see it that way and he disagrees with them. That does not mean he is not going to follow the law and set them aside but when you can come up with a reasonable process that changes the status as is consistent with the Supreme Court ruling it is the right thing to do. He has been advocating that we support the Department of State's guidance when he agrees with it and when he does not agree with it, along with the Supreme Court decision when he agrees with it and when he does not.

Commissioner D'Agostino said in his mind, following the process advocated by the Secretary of State would not ensure fair and equal treatment of everyone in this situation, meaning that it would violate the Constitution of the United States and Pennsylvania, and he is not going to violate his oath to the Constitution.

Commissioner Lehman disagreed, saying it treats everybody fairly because if each omission associated with a ballot is treated equally then we are treating everybody fairly. His argument from the beginning has been to be transparent with the process to the greatest extent possible and in a fair process people are notified.

Amy Ruffo asked what happens to the mail-in and absentee ballots those three days after election day if after the eight days there is no decision by the Supreme Court or the Pennsylvania Supreme Court.

Commissioner Parsons said we are going to have to comply with the law and the law right now says that they all have to be done within eight days. If there is no decision from the U.S. Supreme Court, because of the certification requirement, in accordance with the decision of the majority of the board, we will proceed with the process of counting them. He asked if Mr. Wenger anticipates the vast majority of these mail-in ballots being processed tomorrow with results available after 8 p.m.

Mr. Wenger noted we are in uncharted territory, but it is his hope that they will have the results of 99% of the 80,000 ballots very close to 8:00 and be able to load the results to the County website and to the State. Then begin on Wednesday morning with the ballots being received today and mid-day with the ballots being received Tuesday depending on staffing and what they have to sort and process.


Commissioner Parsons said this is important information for everybody to understand, because it is a little different than in past years.
