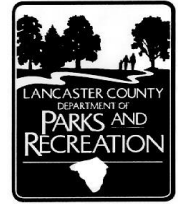

Munchkin scientists will have the opportunity to study the water and critters of the Mill Creek. The animals that live in the creek are an accurate indicator of water quality. As munchkins catch critters with nets and hands, we will place them in a collection tub so we can identify what is living in the stream. With their new knowledge, the munchkin scientists will be able to make a conclusion about the health of the Mill Creek.
