

KEY POINTS
Recovery Houses

- Effective June 9, 2022, many Recovery Houses in the State of Pennsylvania were required to be licensed through the Department of Drug & Alcohol Programs (DDAP).

 - Which Recovery Houses Need a License?**
 - *Drug and alcohol recovery houses must get a license in order to accept:*
 1. *Referrals from state agencies or state-funded facilities, or*
 2. *Federal or state funding to deliver recovery house services.*
 - *In addition, the law imposes two additional requirements on referrals to recovery houses:*
 1. *Persons whose treatment is funded with state or federal funds shall only be referred to licensed recovery houses.*
 2. *Courts shall give first consideration to licensed recovery houses when residential recommendations are made for individuals under their supervision.*
- LCDAC shall remain in compliance with the laws and regulations set forth in the State of Pennsylvania in that this office shall ONLY provide information on the Recovery Houses with a DDAP Recovery House license.
- There is limited funding available for the rental costs associated for living in a DDAP licensed Recovery House.
 - A one-time scholarship for a limited number of qualified individuals is available through the Capital Area Behavioral Health Collaborative (CABHC).
