Facts about Lancaster County Drug & Alcohol Commission (LCDAC)

- ◆ LCDAC is also referred to as a Single County Authority (SCA).
- ◆ The administrative office is located at: 150 North Queen Street, Suite 402; Lancaster, PA 17603.
- ◆ Office hours: 8:30am –5:00pm Mon-Fri.
- ◆ LCDAC is responsible for the oversight of the drug & alcohol services within Lancaster County.
- ◆ No direct services are provided at the office site.
- ◆ LCDAC contracts out all direct services to providers throughout Lancaster County.
- ◆ LCDAC provides funds to ensure that under-insured and non-insured individuals can receive drug & alcohol treatment services.
- ◆ LCDAC also provides funds for evidence - based prevention services in school, community and home-based settings.
- ◆ If you have any issues/problems/concerns regarding any drug & alcohol services within Lancaster County, contact (717) 299-8023.
- ◆ LCDAC and its contracted service providers shall give the identified Priority Populations preference to treatment as follows and, in the following order: Pregnant women who inject drugs; Pregnant women who use substances; Persons who inject drugs (PWID); Overdose survivors; Veterans .

Help is available for alcohol and other drug problems in Lancaster County. Here's how you can find help for yourself or someone else:

- ➔ If you believe you or someone you know needs withdrawal management (detox) services, call White Deer Run Call Center at (866) 769-6822 or Pennsylvania Adult and Teen Challenge at (844) 888-8085.
- ➔ If you think you might need treatment OR are required to obtain an evaluation, contact one of the listed outpatient providers and they will schedule an assessment appointment to determine if you need treatment and if so, what treatment recommendations would be in your best interest.

LCDAC Contracted Outpatient Treatment Service Providers

How do I pay for treatment?

I have Insurance or HMO - Most insurance companies cover D&A treatment. Contact your insurance company to determine what is covered and how to properly access this benefit. It is important to follow the correct procedures. In some cases, pre-authorization from the HMO is required. Some D&A facilities will assist you in working with your insurance company.

I have Veterans Benefits - Most military veterans are eligible for D&A treatment services. Both the Lebanon and Coatesville VA Hospitals provide D&A treatment services. Call (800) 409-8771 Ext. 4543.

I have Medicaid/MA - Contact PerformCare 888-722-8646 or pa.performcare.org for covered drug & alcohol services for adults, adolescents, and children.

I can pay privately - If you have the ability to pay for your D&A treatment, you may choose any facility you can afford.

I don't have a way to pay - If you think you may need withdrawal management (detox) services, call White Deer Run Call Center at **(866) 769-6822** or Pennsylvania Adult and Teen Challenge at **(844) 888-8085** for a short phone assessment. If appropriate, they will begin a bed search to look for treatment accommodations for you. They will also help you determine if you are eligible for County funding, or help you determine how to pay for your treatment. If you do not need withdrawal management, but think you may need inpatient rehab, **call and make an appointment with an outpatient clinic** for an evaluation and a financial liability review.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can someone who refuses treatment be “committed”? Adults cannot be committed for drug and alcohol treatment. There are limited circumstances where adolescents can be committed by their parents through **Act 53**, which requires legal intervention.

I was arrested for DUI in another state and told I need to take some kind of class. Who do I call? Contact Lancaster County **Adult Probation Unit** at (717) 299-8181.

My child is still in high school and I am worried that she may be beginning to experiment with drugs. Who should I call? Contact your child's guidance counselor or school nurse and ask for a referral to the **Student Assistance Program** at her school.

My child was arrested for underage drinking or got in trouble at school for alcohol or drugs. They need to take a class. Who do I call? Contact Compass Mark at (717) 299-2831 x231 to sign up for the **Skills for Life** program.

I think there is drug activity in my neighborhood. Who do I call? In an emergency, always call 911. If it is not an emergency, contact your local police or the **Lancaster County Drug Task Force** at (800) 422-1380.

I just want Case Management Services, can I get these without entering treatment services? **YES**, you can! Contact one of the listed **Case Management Service Providers**.
