**Briefly explain how the project meets the County's guidelines.**

This proposed project would provide sanitary sewer to 20 homes in Creek View Lane area as described in the Strasburg Township ACT 537 Plan of 2013. It will be a one-time request with no ongoing operational funds needed. Strasburg Township will provide matching funds up to 60% of the total cost. Strasburg Township has an existing inter-municipal agreement with the Strasburg Borough Authority to provide bulk sewer capacity. Strasburg Township, in conjunction with the Borough Authority, completed installation of a connection from the end of Creek View Lane to the Authority's pumping station on Village Road in 2020 as a first step in providing service.

**Why should this project be a priority and how will it help the County?**

Excerpts from the 2013 Strasburg Township ACT 537 Plan:

- Executive Summary

“Public sewer service should be provided ... in the Creekview Study Area when adequate public funding becomes available.

As discussed throughout this Plan, the .... Creekview Study Areas are the only areas of the Township currently utilizing OLDS which currently requires an upgrade of sewage facilities to correct malfunctioning OLDS. The structural alternatives evaluated in this Plan to provide public sewer service to these Study Areas represent technically feasible solutions for wastewater management in these areas.”

- Chapter 3 Section 3.4.1 Residential Complaints and Requests for Service

“Most of the complaints have been due to malfunction of aging OLDS and/or small lot sizes. Some residents in the.... Creekview Study Area have requested public sewage service in order to avoid future malfunctions of their OLDS systems.

- Chapter 3 Table 3-3 Summary of Tier 2 Survey Malfunction Categories

At the time of the survey, there were 13% confirmed, 19% suspected and 62% potential malfunctions in the Creekview Study Area.

- Chapter 3 Table 3-5 Tier 2 Well Water Survey Results

At the time of the survey, 90% of the properties tested in the Creekview Study Area had coliform present and 11% had fecal coliform present.

- Chapter 5 Section 5.10.2 Alternatives for the Creekview Study Area

“The Creekview Study Area was identified as a Tier 2 Study area due to small lot sizes and relatively dense residential development. In addition, this area is located in close proximity to existing sanitary sewer systems owned by the Strasburg Borough Authority and by Suburban Lancaster Sewer Authority.”

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
